STIRCHLEY NEIGHBOURHOOD FORUM ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

round 50 residents attended our AGM this year. As the committee stood down ready for re election, Sgt Isobel Knowles from Bournville police station took the chair, in her opening notes, she said of the good work Stirchley Neighbourhood Forum do for the community and thanked the group for making police issues a regular Agenda item at their monthly meetings. After the annual report was read and the annual accounts were presented, the forum chairman re took the chair, and introduced, Mr. Jeremy Shields as the guest speaker for the evening.

Mr. Shields is responsible for fleet and waste management for Birmingham City Council.

The presentation outlined the strategies of the City Council with regard to waste collection and particularly the Recycling policies currently used. Birmingham as a city has the lowest percentage of waste sent to landfill in the country, this is around 12% at the moment, South Birmingham has two Public Waste Disposal Sites at Lifford Lane and Tyseley.

Following extraction of the recyclable materials such as paper, plastic bottles, metals and fabrics most combustible waste is burnt at the incinerator based at Tyseley which currently produces some 30 Mega watts of electricity which is pumped into the National Grid. A large percentage of the Green Waste is composted and sold to be used as commer-

cial fertilizer or ground cover material. As well as the regular Refuse collections Waste Management is also responsible for street cleaning either by the Beat Sweepers or by mechanical means, whilst the standard of street cleaning is regarded as good, but problems can occur in places such as where takeaways are located and it appears that a lot of people would rather drop litter than place it in a convenient bin, where local initiatives have been employed improvements have been seen but it still remains a major problem especially amongst school age people. Street cleansing has been reorganised on a "Ward Basis" and it is proposed that Household Refuse be collected on a similar basis, this may result in your bins being emptied on a different day or at a different time, this is still ongoing and any changes will be notified to local residents in

Plenty of time.

Residents were also asked to note that the

"Green Waste " collections would be suspended from 1st December until 1st March 2011, a problem occurring with green waste is that the waste is bagged up and put out when it is created not when the bags are due for collection, this results in piles of uncollected sacks hanging around and going rotten for up to 14 days!

.After the meeting ended there were refreshments available to those who had chosen to stay behind.

This gave ample time for residents to talk to the police and their local councillors.
