atthew commenced his presentation by giving a brief run down of his career in Retail Management and Local Government Management within Cornwall and the Bristol Areas. The Role of the

Town Centre Manager is to represent the Local Business community, drive forward various initiatives and act as a champion for the area.

The post has been funded from the Working Neighbourhood Fund for a period of 18 months and is designed to target the local area rather than the city centre. Local Priorities will be established, to improve the retail environment and support local businesses, particular issues in Stirchley being;

Empty retail units, lack of local investment, the on going "store wars" regarding the old BT site on Hunts Road. Marketing advice can be given and it may be advantageous if some units were to have a change of use as this might bring some units back into use.

Council grants might be available to assist this. The plan so far is to meet the local traders to establish a form of "local traders association" to enable targets to be set and put an infrastructure in place for the future and enable a long term view to be taken.

LOCAL POLICE BOUNDARY CHANGES

would like to introduce myself. I am Sergeant Isobel Knowles. I lead a team of officers who regularly patrol and work in Stirchley and neighbouring Kings Heath South. I have been working in Stirchley for the past three years and I am always impressed at the hard working and community minded people who make up this neighbourhood. Some of you may have heard that police boundaries are to change. From April 2010 Stirchley will be policed from Bournville Lane Police Station. The neighbourhood teams will be aligned to the council ward boundaries within council constituencies. This means Stirchley neighbourhood team will be joining up with neighbourhood officers from Bournville Lane Police Station to become the Bournville Ward Police Neighbourhood Team, covering Bournville, Cotteridge and Stirchley. We will work closely with officers covering the other three wards within Selly Oak Constituency. The move will give us more resilience to be available when we are needed within the Bournville Ward. It will also assist in our partnership work with the council and make us more effective in dealing with local issues.

If you would like to know more about changes to policing in your area or you have any policing concerns or issues that you feel we could help you with or even if you just want to get to know us better we are always willing to come and visit you, or you can call me on the below telephone number. You can also meet us at one of our monthly neighbourhood tasking meetings. These meetings are for the local community to bring issues to a panel of police, local Councillors and council staff. We take your priorities and work together with yourselves to address and resolve problems in your neighbourhood. Issues we have addressed in the past year in Stirchley have included anti social behaviour, graffiti, speeding, inconsiderate parking, litter and fly tipping to name just a few. We also hold regular daytime PCSO surgeries in Stirchley and one of us attends all Stirchley Forum meetings. We will continue to be available for you at all of these venues after April
